Over the years of living in the United States I have come to build a passion to support, advocate and voice the people's needs, wants, and opinions domestically and internationally. This department that I am asking to be funded by the United States Government, Would focus its attention on international and domestic Crises, Security concerns, natural disasters, and unnatural Human threats. This department would focus its attention more on a person-centered basis. along with providing Internal and External Aid to foreign Governments and their citizens. Some Emergency Services that this department will offer are as follows...

1. War and devastation emergency Services
2. Refugee Housing, Food emergency Program Services
3. Children/Youth and young adult Education Services
4. Family, Children, Youth, and Young adult Emergency Services
5. Emergency Funding Services
6. Adoption Assistant Services
7. Emergency Shelter Program Assistance
8. International security Personal Services
9. Citizenship assistance Program
10. Reffural Assistance Program

The UFS(United Foreign Services) Would partner with the following departments to assist in providing services in the utmost and the highest level of Support, advocacy, education, and providing Emergency and non-emergency Aid.

- Department Of State
- Department Of Defense
- Department Of Homeland Security

- International UN leaders
- Nonprofit Organizations that provided Refugee Services

Along With An monthly Written Budget and weekly updated report on efforts in Supporting, advocating, and voicing refugee citizens' immediate needs and concerns, While maintaining updates and support to Foreign Governments that are in humanitarian crises.

Communication and reporting is the most vital way of displaying positive and or negative cause and effect to Specific worldwide emergencies. The head secretary (Myself) of, The Department Of Foreign Services, Commits to maintaining an open log of communication and reporting between the president of the United States and or Vice President, the public, and the Departments Listed above.

Closing statement:

I love the two countries of America and Ukraine. I hate watching, the innocent lives of children, Women, and men being pulled away from each other, forced to fight and or survive on their own with little to no help or hope. We saw this in the Ukrainian conflict with the Russian government, We saw an Overwhelming Strength, perseverance, and persistence against the Coup that was being pressed against the Ukrainian government and its citizens. We saw the Citizens of Ukraine taking up arms with Zelenskyy the Ukrainian president and rioting against the Russian Government and Army.

Children have been killed, Innocent life a gift from God being taken away forcefully without any chance or option of survival. buildings were blown up, A cancer center was hit and a child was killed and many more were wounded. Orphanages were attacked, and while a family of 4 that was trying to leave to look for safety, were shot to death, one of the children was a 4th-grade young girl. Women children and the elderly leave their homes by the hundreds, leaving a life behind without any idea of what really was happening while in fear of not knowing if they will ever see their young children who were fighting in the military for their country. Children slept in subways and under mattresses, in hopes, they will make it to the next day. While praying to God for protection for their loved

ones that were forced to stay behind and fight in a war that the Ukrainian people Never asked for or started.

In the Afghanistan crisis, there were so many that were forced into an unwanted, unsafe life-threatening environment. Children, women, and men along with Americans and other military personnel were left behind or worse. We even saw this in the Cuban crisis as well as men, women, and children who were being tortured imprisoned, and left behind, while crying out for aid, support, and justice.

Finally, We saw a humanitarian crisis right here at home, with thousands of immigrants coming to America and having nowhere to go. so many immigrants started to gather under a bridge in Texas and live there until aid could be provided. women children and men were there until services could be provided.. did the Immigrants cause an unsafe environment absolutely, and they make many Texans, and other citizens upset and worried yes, but this is why it's crucial to have a department that can provide person-centered humanitarian, emergency, and nonemergency services along with other international and domestic services that can provide immigrants, refugees, survivors, families, and children the aid they need to get back on their feet and show the world their value in there good given potential life.

Life is a gift from God, the very breath is the air that god breathes in us, is a gift that we often take for granted. . Watching all these tragedies take place and the death of an innocent life being taken so carelessly, and unjustly is enough to make me sick and sad. Some of these disasters that led to the destruction of human life could have been avoided and saved. That's why I believe creating this department would not only show the world that we Americans care about each other and the value of life, but the government of the United States can work, collaborate and maintain positive relations with our allies and the citizens all around the world. while creating and expanding amazing programs for human life, equality, and service.

I would be honored to be a part of this positive life-changing choice that this Department would offer to so many people and opportunities for second chances. I believe if we open this department, it could have a big impact on our relationship with other countries, destabilizing the concerning numbers of the overpopulation illegal immigrants, that are in desperate and need of aid and

support, that's why they come to the United States. The Department of United Foreign Services can open more employment opportunities and allow people to support and bring about the change that needs to happen.

What are the programs and Qualifications for each program:

There will be two categories for the services that the UFS will offer. The categories are International and Domestic Services.

Services Offered:

War and Devastation Emergency Services: This service would be for Citizens who are caught in a war zone, and or in a natural disaster of any kind, and need help to escape. The UFS would send out special trained Agents who would be accompanied by International Security Personnel Officers of 150 or more, depending on the severity of the location and the situation. The Number of ISPOs can be lower than 150 if the threat of the location and ratio of surviving citizens are not as high. ISPOs can NOT Interfere with war crossfire between the military personnel Unless, it is in relation to protecting the survivor, a fellow ISPO, or him or herself. The Secretary of United foreign Services can only approve the involvement of an ISPO with the military, unless of an emergency conflict in which the Commander of 150 more or less of ISPOs may make an emergency decision, in which he or she does NOT need the approval from the Secretary of United Foreign Services.

Please Note: If a President and or world leader Of a Country has put in an executive or emergency order, Where he or she has ordered an age cap limit of citizens of that country, to participate in the war, an ISPO can not Defy the orders of that President and or Leader, and must abide by the emergency order. If the survivor is in need of medical attention and or hurt significantly, an ISPO along with the Emergency Disaster Agent (EDA) is responsible to maintain the safety and wellbeing of that citizen and may take that citizen to safety, away from the war zone. The ISPO Must Notify his or her commander right away and the commander must immediately Notify the Office of the United Foreign Services.

Refugee Housing, Food emergency Program Services: This Service is for Citizens that are fleeing their country due to war and or natural disaster, and is in need of help in regards to food, water, shelter, clothing, and safety. The UFS will provide Refugees with the necessary basic human needs such as food, Water, Safety, Clothing, and Shelter. There will be On borders in European countries, and western Borders of countries, Temporary Shelters provided by the US Department of United Foreign Services. Inside there will be a bed, running Hot and cold water, One shower, an eating space, and a small sitting space along with blankets and towels. A refugee will be provided free of charge a benefit refugee temporary counselor, their responsabliltie is to listen to the survivor and help them fill out applications for more free of charge temporary services. A refugee may only stay at the temporary Shelter for no more than 4 weeks, anything over that time period the Secretary of United foreign Services must approve or deny the time for that refugee. Approval will be based on the willingness and cooperation of the refugee. During this time frame, the BRTC (Benefit Refugee Tempary Councilor) is to work quickly but adequately with the department of United Foreign Services to assure that there are more long-term services for the surviving refugees.

Children/Youth and young adult Education Services: This Service benefits Families with children internationally and domestically, children that live in the United States and are in need of education assistance, The Department of United Foreign Services can advocate and even intervene on behalf of the student's and their families. The UFS can provide families in the states with an education advocate. This worker will advocate for the student in regards to his or her education, issues with staff, other school administrators, students, and behaviors during class time, along with suggesting referrals to other community-based services. If the Student Has an IEP (Individual Education Plan) the advocate may be able to provide you free of charge services. If the Individual Has an IEP then that student and their family automatically qualify for the Education Services and may opt-out and terminate services anytime during the advocate's time while working with the student and their family.

For families in Europe who are in the Emergency Shelter Assistance Program. This program automatically qualifies individuals and their families for Education

services, the family will be assigned an Education advocate who will sign up the child to a school with the family within the district of the shelter. The family can and may opt out of this service anytime during the duration of their stay in the shelter.

Family, Children, Youth, and Young adult Emergency Services: This service is for Children, Youth, and Young Adults who may have lost their families in war or natural and unnatural disasters. In this service, the Department Of United Foreign Services Will assisted Support and offer Services to those who are between the ages of 3 to 23 years of age. There will be housing for 3 to 10 years of age, 10 to 17 years of age in another home, and a home for 17 to 23 years of age. Each house can hold up to 20 survivors. This program will only allow Survivors to stay up to a year (12 Months) unless the Secretary of United Foreign Services Approves more time for that survivor. Children in this program will be enrolled in a day program and or education to ensure that children have the opportunities to gain and grow in their education. This also reduces the likelihood of surviving children being bored and getting into mischief. For residents who do not need education services. Other activities such ad learning independent skills life skills and other human basic skills will be provided in relation to their goals, needs, and wants.

For children who are 16 years and under of age, will receive a Childcare advocate Worker, where he or she will work with the Survivors country Government, United Foreign Services, policies, and other restrictions that may apply to that child, in regards to their safety, housing, Temporary financial assistance, Services and or placing the child into a care facility such as an adoption agency. The Survivor will be placed in an emergency Housing program, while their Childcare advocate Worker, advocates for services on the survivor's behalf with the UFS and the survivor's country government.

The goal for the childcare advocate Worker is to provide long-term services to increase the value of life, safety, and Stability of that child while in the care of the childcare advocate and any facility the child is placed in. The Emergency Housing Program will be fully stocked with food, Hot and cold water, Showers, 20 beds, blankets, towels, and other necessities for the children that are residing there. There will be staff there that will work around the clock (24 hours a day) to

ensure the safety and well-being of every child is being met while the surviving child is awaiting more services. Three meals and snacks will be provided daily during the duration of the children's stay, along with transportation to health appointments and other appointments that are needed for the child. Activities will be provided for the child's emotional and physical health and state of mind. Such activities could include.

- Movies
- Bowling
- Independent structure time
- Art and crafts
- Electronic time
- Community-based activities
- Therapy Recreation

These are just a few things that the children that are in the Emergency Housing program can do for entertainment.

The ultimate goal is to reunite the child with their parents and or a family member, but if there is no way of finding and or getting information on the child's guardians then the child must be put into the Emergency Housing Program where he or she may stay up to 12 months. While in the Program Parents back in the United States have the option to adopt the children right from the Housing program. Further information on how to do that will be on the Department Of United Foreign Services website.

Children and young adults 17 and older, will be provided Immediate emergency Housing in which the survivor lives or on the surrounding borders of the child's home country, based on the safety and situation of the environment, temporary Financial Assistance, and other services like citizenship to the united states can be offered to the child. The child will receive a Care Manager whare he and she will be responsible and represent the needs of the child to the Department Of United Foreign Services and the Government Of the survivor's Country. The UFS will work closely and will collaborate with the necessary Governments of the youth's Country along with the Department Of State, and the Department Of Homeland Security, to ensure all measures of safety, health, and other basic human needs are met in relation to all surviving children that the UFS has in its care.

Emergency Funding Services: This service allows children, young adults, and families to tap into Financial Assistance Crises services. This service allows Survivors of a Domestic Disaster, and or International Disaster to have some financial relief. Anyone who is in an Emergency Shelter and or Housing program automatically qualifies for this service. The amount of how much and how often you may be entitled to receive will be based on several factors. Some of those factors are as follows...

1. How much money were you making a month and year before the domestic and or international disaster happened?
2. Do you have access to your money if so, how immediate can you get access to your money?. If you can not have or get access to your money, what is the cause of it?
3. How well is your money management skills
4. How many children do you have
5. Are you married
6. What have you lost in regards to the disaster?

These questions help the Department Of United Foreign Services to come up with an amount of money you could be entitled to and how often you may be entitled to receive that amount of money.

The max that an independent refugee over the age of 18 years old, can receive, is between the amount of \$450.00 and \$800.00 either monthly or weekly equaling to the max amount shown above.

Families with children May be entitled to receive between the amount of \$1,000.00 to 1,300.00 a month or weekly equaling to the max amount received.

Survivors under the age of 18 and are dependent on them selfs may be entitled to receive between 250.00 to 450.00 a month or weekly equaling to the max amount received.

The total amounts are determined by how much loss a family or individual has experienced if they have money and if they can get access to their money. What kind of a job did they have and how much did they make monthly and yearly Do they have children and or if they're married. These are the qualifying factors that will help the UFS determine how much can be provided to the refugees, survivors, families, and children.

Adoption Assistant Services: This service can be for anyone in the United States and internationally. We house children in the emergency Housing Program who have lost their parents, and or guardians. Therefore are in need of love, support, and care. The UFS can only support the children for so long before we have to have them move out from the Emergency Housing Program and into other services and or adoption agencies. We highly encourage families looking to adopted and have the ability to do so, to look on our website and requested to talk to an adoption counselor. They can provide you with the necessary steps in how to go about starting the process.

Emergency Shelter Program Assistance: This is a service for families who are fleeing a country, natural disaster, or are Homeless. In this service, the UFS offers a 6 to 12-month stay shelter that can provide support, advocation, food, water, and other necessities in regards to what families needs. While in this program families will be assigned a Case Manager. His or her responsibility is to support, advocate and obtain more services for the families. The care Manger will participate in making sure all needs are met for families on their caseload. Emergency Shelters will be stationed in western and European Countries. The care manager must maintain Communication with the office of United Foreign Services and if need be other community-based programs. The shelters can hold no more than 30 people at a time. There will be Staff there 24 hours around the clock that will be there to support and maintain safety within the buildings.

International security Personal Services: This Service supports individuals that are trapped in a war zone natural and unnatural disasters and threats. The department Of United Foreign Services will collaborate and work with the Department Of Homeland Security, The Department Of Defence, and the Department of State. On an international and domestic basis. The UFS will send out Specially trained agents accompanied by ISPOs (International Security Personnel Officers) to go into the war zones, and or Natural disasters and look for survivors. The ISPOs can not interfere with military personal combat and or crossfire of any kind unless it is in relation to protecting the survivor, a fellow ISPO, and him or herself. If an ISPO is requested to assist in military personal combat of any kind. The Department Of the United Foreign Services Secretary must approve or deny the request, Unless of emergency circumstances where immediate assistance and or action is needed in which the commander of 150 more or less of ISPOs may make an emergency decision without the approval of the UFS Secretary.

Please Note: If a President Of a Country has put in an executive or emergency order, Where he or she has ordered an age cap limit of citizens of that country, to participate in the war, an ISPO can not Defy the orders of that President and must abide by the emergency order. If the survivor is in need of medical attention and or hurt significantly, an ISPO Along with the Emergency Disaster Agent (EDA) is responsible to maintain the safety and wellbeing of that citizen and may take that citizen to safety, away from the war zone. The ISPO Must Notify his or her commander right away and the commander must immediately Notify the Office of the United Foreign Services.

Citizenship Assistance Program: The Department Of United Foreign Services (UFS) Offers services to anyone internationally and domestically in regards to obtaining American citizenship. The Department Of Home Land Security (DHS) also helps immigrants on the United States Borders and other countries looking for citizenship. therefore, the United States departments of DHS and UFS Will work Closely together to help immigrants obtain citizenship in a legal fashion. Furthermore, the UFS will help immigrants with Temporary housing Assistance for those seeking asylum, food, water, shelter, and other necessities will be provided. The Temporary Housing assistance Program is for immigrants who meet the qualifications at the border and under the UFS Policies.

- Must show Identification if you have children that they are your children
- Must not be fleeing from a charge that is above a misdemeanor
- Must be willing to follow the rules and policies of the DHS and UFS Departments
- Must be able to show progress and willing to adapt to change
- Must not have any record in regards to violent outbursts in the last 4 years exceptions may apply based on approval of the Secretary of UFS
- No drugs of any kind unless he or she has been approved to have them by a Border Patrol agent and or can show documentation that the medications are for disease and or other health-related concerns. if approved the immigrant will be provided a lockbox with a key. a key will also be given to shelter staff for emergency purposes.

The Qualifications above are just a few in regards to the Temporary housing Assistance program for immigrants seeking shelter and safety, furthermore, free transportation will be provided to court dates and other required locations in regards to seeking citizenship and asylum if the immigrant is in the care of the department of United Foreign services.

Referral Assistance Program: In this service, we offer referrals to other community-based or government departments' services for international and domestic refugees, immigrants, families, children, and survivors. All of our Services that this department offers are voluntary which means that if a consumer wishes to leave during or after the duration of time receiving services through the (DUFS) Department Of United Foreign Services, then it is the consumer's right to do so. Referrals can be made by the following sources...

- Country's leaders and presidents
- United States US and State Departments officials
- Border Patrol Officials
- Disaster Organisation officials
- Education School Officials and Councilors
- Local, County, and Village Officials
- Non-profit agencies
- Adoption agencies

In each service, the main goal is to assist, support, advocate, and provide non-emergency and Emergency services internationally and Domestically. The Department Of United Foreign Services is committed to providing equal, basic, and supportive services to anyone who wishes to receive them. Again the Services offered by this Department are voluntary. When receiving services it's our goal to provide our survivors, Immigrants, refugees, families, and children a second chance in life while maintaining their safety, respect, confidentiality, and the ability to work together against the misfortunes of their situation.

What does your Department need to Operate adequately?

The Department will need the following to be able to function and provide services adequately...

- Financial Stability (United states congress, fundraisers, grants)
- Staff(staff that can speak several languages fluently)
- Vehicles
- Access to planes
- Electronics
- Furniture, Blankets, Towels, pillows
- Water, Food, Utensils, and plates
- Corporate Building(Washington DC)
- Leasing building or renting
- Contracts with a company for heating and cooling and other services
- Office supplies
- Phones
- Computers
- Approved Business Bank from the United States Government

These are just the beginning of what we will need to start operations for this department.

The UFS will request yearly Funds from the US Congress and have year around Donation opportunities and fundraisers open to the United States Public.

Refugee housing is meant to provide shelter and safety to families that are fleeing from their homes. The Department of United Services Is asking the United States Congress to approved funds in the amount of 10 billion dollars, this fund will help the UFS to start undergoing construction around the world and the Secretary of United foreign Services negotiates land areas where these small safe havens can be built. inside there will be one bed, a small eating area, hot and cold water, Blankets, Towels, Food, Water, and other necessities that a family would need. these are temporary save heavens, meaning a family or person can not stay more than 4 weeks at a time due to the number of others who are in need of the same services. that is why each family, and person will receive a refugee temporary benefits counselor. so he or she can help the family and or individual in obtaining more services.

Children/Youth and young adult Education Services: In this Program, We are asking Congress to approve funds in the amount of: 500,000.00, With this amount of money, the Department Of United Forgrin Services can invest in portable laptops, pads, and other electronics for the Education Advocates to utilize when participating in the community-based meeting and other required Program Services for the Students and his or her family. some of these funds can even help families in obtaining schools supplies and other necessities for the school year.

Family, Children, Youth, and Young adult Emergency Services: The fund amount the department is asking for is in the amount of \$ 4million dollars, due to the amount of food, water, clothing, and other necessities the UFS has to keep stock in the Emergency housing program for the consumers between the ages of 3 and 23. UFS hopes to have multiple sites across Europe and the western countries by the end of 2025, Furthermore, we ask for additional funds for the recreational structure of the consumers. the amount of funds this department is

asking for is in the amount of \$ 600,000.00 this total will be shared between the different emergency Housing programs across the world.

What Are the Qualifications and responsibilities for each Job title?

Administrative staff:

Department Secretary: This position requires him or her to handle and run the affairs of the department while maintaining a good level of communication between US officials, departments, community-based services, the United States public, and world leaders. the Secretary is also responsible to provide a safe, and engaging environment within and out of the workplace for all personnel that works for the Department Of United Foreign Services. He or she must be able to do the following to be considered for this position...

- Must be willing to travel within the united states and out of the country
- must be able to work with US departments and officials adequately and on a team basis
- Must be able to Communicate Clearly and effectively to personnel and other sources within the community, US government, and with world leaders
- Must abide by the US and other foreign Government policies.
- Must stay calm in high tensions and or environments that could lead to dangerous and even Life-threatening situations
- must be willing to support staff in unsafe and even life-threatening environments.
- must be willing to listen to all personnel needs and suggestions while providing growth and opportunity within the Department
- Must maintain a high level of Reporting/documenting, meetings, and safety, while hearing to the United States policies in regards to training, licensing, and other personnel documents needed to successfully provide services through the US federal government.
- Must handle disciplinary actions between personnel and Administration staff.

Deputy Secretary: In this position, she or she will be responsible to support the department's Affairs while maintaining all required meetings, training, and reporting/documenting.

In this position he or she is the acting secretary, therefore when the Department Secretary is not available, the Deputy Secretary will be responsible for the following...

- Must be willing to travel within the United States and out of the country
- must be able to work with US departments and officials adequately and on a team basis
- Must be able to Communicate Clearly and effectively to personnel and other sources within the community, US government, and with world leaders
- Must abide by the US and other foreign Government policies.
- Must stay calm in high tensions and or environments that could lead to dangerous and even Life-threatening situations
- must be willing to support staff in unsafe and even life-threatening environments.
- must be willing to listen to all personnel needs and suggestions while providing growth and opportunity within the Department
- Must maintain a high level of Reporting/documenting, meetings, and safety, while hearing to the United States policies in regards to training, licensing, and other personnel documents needed to successfully provide services through the US federal government.
- Must handle disciplinary actions between personnel and Administration staff.

The Deputy Secretary will oversee immigration departments and maintain a high level of communications between the immigration personnel and shelters.

Chief Of Staff: The Chief Of staff will be in charge of maintaining chief executive scheduling, meetings, and planning travel, collaborating with the Executive Members to determine and prioritize department/ business strategies, he or she will also be responsible for providing department leaders with recommendations in how to improve teamwork construction throughout the department affairs.

Chief Financial Officer: The CFO's duties include tracking cash flow and financial planning as well as analyzing the Department's financial strengths and weaknesses and proposing corrective actions. while having regular meeting follow-ups with the Department Secretary and Deputy Secretary to report any significant financial changes and course of actions that need and or should be taken to correct any issues financially.

International and domestic Emergency Deployment Advisor: the International and domestic emergency deployment Advisor's responsibilities are to maintain communication with ISPOS and (EDAs) When deploying them on the ground in countries, due to a threat and or natural disaster. The Advisor Must Maintain Effective and clear communication with the Department Secretary and Deputy Secretary, in relation to advising them if and when to deploy ISPOs and EDAs to the ground of a country due to Ceracuring casualties, threats, and or assistance to a UFS international and domestic shelters. Furthermore, the advisor will be the key point of contact for ISPOs and EDAs if and when they need anything and or reporting an issue.

International and Domestic Advisor: the International and domestic advisor, is responsible for collaborating with the International and domestic Emergency Deployment Advisor while reporting and communicating to the Department Secretary and Deputy Secretary. furthermore, the IDA will be responsible to keep in contact with the international, domestic, and management staff, to ensure that they are stocked on supplies and other necessities they need to maintain services to families, children survivors, and refugees. The IDA is to maintain positive relations with world leaders and or presidents, He or she will be responsible for effectively communicating on behalf of the Department of United Foreign Services in relation to support, and aid to consumers receiving services through the Department of UFS.

Communications Director: The Communications Director is responsible to communicate between advisors and other Management staff internationally and domestically, he or she will be responsible to maintain all forms of communication on the UFS website along with holding press briefings to the public in relation to issues the department is currently facing and battling. the Communications Director Must report and communicate with The chief of Staff, the Department secretary, and or Deputy Secretary at least twice a week.

Emergency Services Director: The Emergency Service Director will be in charge of maintaining effective communication between Management in housing Programs and other emergency programs internationally and domestically. he or she must report to the Chief of staff, deputy Secretary and or the Department secretary twice a week. the Emergency director may approve additional funds if a program is in need of them for providing adequate services to refugees children and families. he or she must maintain a high level of documentation and reporting when in communications with his or her Department Program Managers.

Immigration and Housing Director: The Immigration and Housing Director will be in charge of Immigration Services and housing for immigrants. He or she must be able to communicate effectively and clearly with his or her staff along with maintaining good communication with the Department of Homeland Security as he or she will be responsible to handle all referrals that the Immigration and housing services receive from (HDS). He or she must be willing to travel to the united stated borders in relation to approving and or denying immigrants for temporary housing. the Director must maintain appropriate and updated documentation daily while maintaining a safe and engaging environment for staff and consumers in this program. He or she Must maintain effective communication with the Deputy Secretary on a regular basis in relation to aid, support, reporting, and other forams of services needed for this program. the Director must be willing to work with local law enforcement if need be to ensure safety for all participants and staff while Maintaining Open effective communication with the Housing Managers.

None emergency Programs Director: The None Emergency programs director will be responsible to maintain open, effective communication between his or her staff, while supporting and aiding families in referral, adoption, and education advocation services, to the united states community while maintaining effective and clear communication with the Emergency Services Director. He or she must be willing to handle disciplinary actions and other staff-related concerns while providing, and maintaining safety policies and measures, for his or her staff and all consumers in this program. The director must communicate and report to the

chief of staff, deputy secretary, and or department secretary twice a week along with providing monthly reports and or requests for more financial, personnel aid.

Department Staff:

Childcare Advocate Worker: The child care Worker, Must obtain a Bachelors's Degree In child care services, and must possess at least 3 years of work experience working with children and or youth. He or she must possess the ability to speak English, Spanish, and be willing to learn more languages if hired by the Department Of United Foreign Services. He or she must be willing to work in stressful and sometimes dangerous environments while providing services to children and their families. The childcare Worker advocate Must display the ability to effectively and clearly communicate with the families, children, and Department of United Forgiens Services quickly but efficiently to obtain more temporary services for children, youth, and their families. The childcare Advocate Worker will have a Case Load of 15 Children and must meet with them on a daily basis, spending a total of 30 minutes with each child to obtain and listen to their concerns and wishes for services. He or she must have or show proof of completion for CPR, Frist Aid, and AED training for adults and young children.

Care Manager: The car Manager Must obtain a Baturalers Degree in Human Services. He or she will need to show the ability to speak English and Spanish fluently and must be willing to learn more Languages if hired by the Department of United Foreign Services. The Care manager must meet with their care of load 15 at least twice a week, more times may be required based on an emergency basisThe care Manger must show the ability to effectively communicate with the Department Of United foreign services along with the Countries survivors government to ensure all services and aid can be provided by both parties. He or she must have or show proof of completion for CPR, Frist Aid, and AED training for adults and young children. he or she must maintain proper and efficient documentation and report daily

International Security Personnel Officers (ISPOs): The War and destination Services officers, Offers International and Domestic Services to individuals that are in need of help, in relation to escaping a natural disaster, war, and or threat. The Potential Candidate for this position must have completed training and show proof of completed combat training and must have 4 years of work-related Emergency Services on the ground Field Experience. furthermore, he or she must be willing to receive firearm and defense training, at which point if competed successfully he or she will receive a certification of completion, through the department Of United Services. He or she must be over the age of 21 years to be considered for this position. He or she must complete 8 weeks of Army boot camp if hired by the Department Of United foreign Services. An ISPO Must be willing to work in hazardous, and even life-threatening Environments, as he or she will be responsible to assist in providing medical aid and protection to the survivors, fellow ISPOs, and Emerggancy Desaster Agents. (EDAs). The potential candidate must be able to display effective listening, communication, and resourceful skills He or she must have or show proof of competition for CPR, Frist Aid, and AED training for adults and young children.

Emergency Desaster Agents (EDAs): The War and destination Services officers, International and Domestic Services to individuals that are in need of help, in relation to escaping a natural disaster, war, and or threat. The Emergency Disaster Agent (EDAs) Must speak fluently in English, Spanish and be willing to learn more languages if hired by the Department of United Foreign Services. He or she must have 4years of experience working in emergency services on the ground experience. he or she must complete firearm and defense training, at which point if completed successfully, he or she will receive a certification of completion, through the department Of United Services. The potential Candidate must be 21 years or older to be considered for this position. He or she must be willing to complete 8 weeks of Army boot camp while showing effective listening, communication, and resourceful skills. He or she must have or show proof of competition for CPR, Frist Aid, and AED training for adults and young children. to be considered for this position.

Benefit Refugee Temporary Counselor (BRTC): The Benefits Refugee Temporary Counselor, is responsible to Listen and Help refugees obtain services through the department Of United Foreign Services (UFS), While maintaining good Positive communication with the refugee's government to ensure other services can be provided for the refugees, through there own country. The potential candidate must possess a bachelor's degree in Human Services and or foreign policies, (a Master's degree is perffred), BRTCs must have 4 to 5 years of experience working in disaster and or emergency types of services to be considered for this position. he or she must speak Spanish and English fluently, and be willing to learn more languages if hired through the Department Of United foreign Services. He or she must be at least 21 years old to be considered for this position and possess or show completion of CPR, First Aid, and AED training for children and adults. He or she must be willing to work stressful, tense, and even dangerous life-threatening, environments while meeting with their caseload of 15 daily to ensure they are being taken care of while awaiting more services through the department of United foreign Services and or their countries Government. He or she Must be able to display effective listening, communication, and negotiation skills.

Education Advocate: The education Advocates responsibility is to ensure the students that there assigned to, on their caseloads are being advocated for, including their families. He or she will meet with the Student and their parents and or guardians at least twice a week, more times may be needed depending on the situation. He or she must have a high school diploma and 2 years of experience working with children and or youth. (an Associates Degree is Perffred). he or she must have a license and must be willing to participate in training and other required classes to perform this job. He or she must be 18 years old to be considered for this position. The education advocate must be able to speak Spanish and English fluently and be willing to learn more languages if hired by the department of United foreign Services. He or she Must be able to Show proof or obtain a certification in CPR, Frist Aid, and AED for children and Adults to be considered for this position. he or she must attend all required meetings for the child while showing the ability to effectively communicate, listen and advocate for the student's and families' needs.

Case Manager: In the Emergency Shelter Program Assistance the care manager is to assist, advocate and support anyone who is fleeing their country. The Case Manager must maintain Communication with the office of United Foreign Services, and if need be other community-based programs to obtain more services on behalf of the family and or independent refugee. this is a 6 to 12-month stay shelter for fleeing consumers, the maximum number of people that can stay in this program is 30, the potential candidate for this position must have a Bachelors Degree in Human Services and must have at least 3 years experience working in emergency services and or with children, youth and adults, He or she must show proof of completion and or obtain a certification in CPR, First Aid, and AED, for children and Adult. the case Manager must meet with his or her caseload to times a week more times may be needed depending on the situation of each person. Furthermore, the candidate must be fluent in English, Spanish and must be willing to learn more Languages if Hired by the Department Of United Foreign Services. He or she must be willing to communicate effectively, and clearly with other foreign governments, community-based services, and Housing Managers. he or she must be 21 years or older to be considered for this position.

Emergency Funding Services: in this service, any Staff working for the department of United Foreign Services, that is in an Emergency housing program and or refugee program, may put in a request for financial aid for Emergency assistance on behalf of their clients.

Adoption Councilors: He or she must be willing to communicate effectively with potential adopters over the phone, computer, and in person. The Adoption Councilors must be able to Speak Spanish and English fluently and must and must learn more languages if hired by the Department Of United foreign Services. The candidate must be 18 years or older and must possess a High school diploma with 2 years of experience working in customer service and or fast food/ retail services. he or she must be able to speak clearly when speaking to potential adopters and must be respectful. adoption counselors must maintain documentation before and after communicating with potential Adopters.

Cleaners: Cleaners' responsibilities are to assist residential workers in maintaining a clean and safe environment for the consumers. He or she must have or show proof of certification of completion for training in cleaning. he or she must be 18 years of age and must have 4 years of experience as a janitor and or cleaner. (Highschool diploma is preferred) he or she must be willing to work all hours of the day and be willing to speak English and Spanish Fluently and willing to learn more languages if Hired by the department of United foreign Services.

Residential workers: residential workers are to maintain the safety and well-being of every participant that is in their care. he or she must possess an associate degree, in Human Services and have 2 years of experience working with children and or youth. (Combined amount of experience of 5 or more years in human services may be considered in place of the AS degree) he or she must show proof and or obtain a Certification in CPR, First Aid, and AED for children and adults. the Residential worker must be willing to work in stressful, tense, and dangerous threat threatening environments. the residential worker must maintain documentation while reporting to the housing manager of any significant issues

Residential Managers: Residential Managers must obtain a master's degree in Human Service, (BA, Degree may be accepted in place of the master degree with 5 years experience in Emergency Management services.) he or she must be over the age of 21 to be considered, willing to work in stressful and even dangerous, tense, life Threatening, environments. The housing manager must maintain effective and clear communication with his or her staff, the Department Of United Foreign Services, and other management Directories on a weekly basis. He or she must main proper and effective reporting and documentation, while addressing Disciplinary actions, and the expansion of growth and opportunity for all residents and staff, Housing Managers must be willing to support all participants in relation to advocating and providing services. He or she must speak fluently English, Spanish and be willing to learn more languages if hired by the Department OF United Foreign services. He or she Must show proof or obtain a certification of completion in CPR, First Aid, and AED for adults and children.

Residential Coordinators: The residential coordinator is responsible for helping oversee the successful completion of training and reviewing reports while assisting the housing manager in any other areas that may be needed. he or she must be over the age of 21 and have a BA Degree in Emergency Management and or Human services. He or she must be willing to work in highly stressful and even dangerous environments while assisting and supporting all participants. He or she must speak fluently English, Spanish and be willing to learn more languages if hired by the Department OF United Foreign services. He or she Must show proof or obtain a certification of completion in CPR, Frist Aid, and AED for adults and children.
